I was at Merry Hill, sitting having a well earned coffee and watching people get off the escalator. I'm thinking how easy it is to get from one level to another via the escalator and vowing to use the stairs more for my health. Beryl always told me that I'd get 'bungalow legs' When I was a youth there was a song in the charts called either 'Stairway to Paradise' or 'Stairway to heaven' so I'm watching and thinking about how we journey through life.

Watching the escalator made me think about life. Some people seemingly start out in life and travel along effortlessly. Others struggle from the minute they are born.

Most of us journey through life as if we're climbing stairs. We all carry baggage. I.e. anxieties, burdens, illnesses, relationship or financial worries, and like climbing stairs, the more we've climbed the more world weary we get.
